# **Alan Gibson News Letter**

Welcome to our Fourth News Letter, the previous News Letters seem to have been well received and it looks like we will be able to produce it on a regular basis. The intention is still to use this News letter to keep customers up to date with the latest things within the business, these will include new products and developments, shows we are attending, kits we have available, etc. For those people who are seeing this news letter for the first time, the previous releases are available from the web site.

## **New Products**

**Brass Centred Wheel Kits** – We will have some additional 'new' brass wheel kits in the range, in either 6' or 6'2". They are 4872 – LMS Class 5, 4872L - LTSR 4-4-2T, 4872S - LSWR H15, 4872V - LNER B13 Class, 4872W - GWR Hall Class, 4873 – SR K Class, 4874H – Highland Loch Class, 4874V – LNER V2 Class, 4874W - GWR Country 4-6-0.

**Conversion Sets** – We will produce a conversion for the Bachmann V2, hopefully by Scaleforum, but definitely in the autumn. Also planned for the autumn, depending on Bachmann and Hornby's release dates are the Bachmann D11/1 and SE&CR C Class and Hornby's GWR 42XX, 52XX & 72XX.

Castings – We have a couple of new castings in the range and some more reworked / re-mastered castings which will hopefully be viewed as an improvement. News items, we have a pack of brass castings for 4mm LNWR lamp brackets which include both Footplate mounted and Bunker/Tender mounted types. The other one is a whitemetal casting pack to Great Centralise (please forgive the expression) the ROD tender with the Bachmann LNER O4.

Reworked castings include all the tender axleboxes in brass by the lost wax process. The whitemetal versions of these items were spread across different moulds and became difficult to keep in stock for all sorts of reasons; not least some of moulds were quite worn. So we now have crisp new moulds which produce the axleboxes and springs in durable brass making soldering a more realistic method of attaching. We have already done this a while ago with the GE axleboxes and very recently the LMS/Midland (some of which have already gone out through the trade), now we're adding the rest. Also in the tender department we have produce brass sprues of fittings for the BR and Stanier Tenders with the intention of being to re introduce the Tender Kits, allowing us to just drop a couple of sprues of castings in a bags rather than sorting through trays of white metal castings (more in the kits section).

We have also adjusted some of the casting prices, certain items have stood out as being a little high and others we've invested in new moulds where we have increased the cost, but also increased the yield. Therefore we are reducing the cost of certain castings including 4M626. 4M652, 4M717, 4M788, 4M797 & 4M814.

**Buffers** – We are also intending to add to our range of cast, sprung buffers. There are two being developed which are GWR 12" head self contained, and GWR Pre 1929 Oval head, square shanked coach buffers with further ones being planned. Unfortunately these are unlikely to be ready for the current group of shows.

**Signals** – We have been commissioned by someone who builds signals to produce some of our signal etches in 7mm. We have already completed the Bath Green Park LMS Cantilever Gantry with others planned. This particular item is to be available only as an etch, without the channels section included in the 4mm pack. These 7mm signals are unlikely to be stock items (not quite made our minds up yet), but will be available to order.

**Catalogue** – We are continuing to develop the catalogue. The emphasis is on the online version as we have to think about production costs of the paper version. Having said that we are still producing a few copies of the full version for sale at shows but in the main that will be available the online version. If that doesn't seem to be a particularly clear statement, then that is because it isn't clear in our heads. The Full version will hopefully eventually contain everything we manufacture; the standard version will contain everything we stock.

Over the period of time we've owned the business it has come to be a concern that we don't provide any guidance on how to use our main products, such as Driving wheels, Bogie/Tender Wheels and Rolling stock wheels. It seems to have always been assumed that the modeller will know what to do. This worries us as there must be numerous people who have bought our products and 'not got on with them' just for the want of a little information. We're not seriously considering putting instructions in every packet because if you bought loco and tender wheels for a Pacific you could have nine or ten bits of paper floating about, also, it would add cost to our packing operations. With all this in mind we've added a section to the Online/Full catalogue giving hints and tips for using and looking after our wheels products. If you're one of those people who don't like to be told how to do things, please don't read that section.

RTR Loco Wheel Conversion Packs – There are finescale societies that produce 'How to' sheets for putting finescale wheels on to proprietary Ready to Run Locos. Great, but, we've no control over which ones they produce, who writes them how many photos there are and of what. Our concern is with our products and our business so we're going to produce our own; or rather we've asked Pete Hill to write them for us. Pete, in some circles anyway, is well known for demonstrating conversions and how just about converted everything that can be done. The Bachman 3F is our first one and is now on the web site, just follow the download link on the website, we'd love to do a sheet for every Loco we list, but only time will tell if we get around to it. We will however, cover all the major types Bachmann, Hornby, 3mm, 2.who knows what mm axles, inside/outside valve gear etc.

These 150 odd kits are in various stages of completion. Had things gone to plan we would have completed them weeks ago, shipped them to the people who want (still) them and would have known how many, if any, were left over, in order that we could take them to shows and put them on general sale. However, we suffered a slight delay with the lost wax castings and an even longer delay with the etching so we just run out of time before having to make stock for the forthcoming shows. We intend to complete the kits ASAP which may extend to after the Manchester show.
